Turnpike Travel Tops Half a Million, Exceeds Last Year's Figures for Memorial Day Weekend

Holiday traffic on the West Virginia Turnpike over the busy Memorial Day holiday weekend totaled 569,763 transactions, exceeding last year's travel numbers by more than 4 percent.

Traffic on the Turnpike from Friday, May 23, 2025, through Monday, May 26, 2025, exceeded 2024's numbers by more than 24,000 transactions, according to officials for the West Virginia Parkways Authority.

The tolls for passenger vehicles on the Turnpike are \$4.50 per plaza. There are three main toll plazas along the Turnpike. Alternately, an E-ZPass costs \$27.50 annually for unlimited use, plus a one-time transponder fee.

To get an E-ZPass, or to renew an existing E-ZPass, download the WVPA E-Zpass mobile app! Drivers may also apply in person at the West Virginia Parkways Authority E-ZPass Customer Service Center, 3310 Piedmont Road, Charleston, West Virginia 25306, or at the Beckley Customer Service Center located at 12 Pikeview Drive, Beckley, West Virginia 25801.

The West Virginia Governor's Highway Safety Program recently held the HWY2SFT Conference, from Wednesday, May 14, 2025, to Friday, May 16, 2025, which brought together a diverse group of highway safety professionals, law enforcement, educators, and advocates for three days of discussions, workshops, and networking. The event was intended to foster collaboration and share best practices to enhance road safety across our communities.

The conference kicked off with a focus on the power of data, featuring a Data and Dashboarding panel in the Opening General Session that was moderated by the Governor's Highway Safety Association CEO, Jonathan Adkins. Insights were shared by Marsha Mays (West Virginia Department of Transportation, American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials) and Tara Casanova-Powell (Association of Transportation Safety Information Professionals), highlighting the power of data in shaping effective safety strategies.





This conference also celebrated law enforcement with the awards banquet handing out many awards to officers who helped keep West Virginia safe over the past year. The speaker for the banquet was James L. Mitchell, Superintendent of West Virginia State Police, along with a few words of encouragement and appreciation from Commissioner of the West Virginia Division of Motor Vehicles, (DMV) Everett Frazier. Barbara Lorbert was handed the first lifetime achievement award for her hard work and dedication with the GHSP. Weirton Police Officer Brandon Palmieri was awarded the Child Passenger Safety Technician Instructor of the Year award while Kanawha County Sheriff's Office took home first for top DUI enforcement in the state.

The conference provided attendees with new insights and strategies to continue their vital work in West Virginia. This conference was a culmination of the hard work that GHSP Director, Jack McNeely, GHSP Division Manager, Amy Boggs, and the entire GHSP team put in to create a conference engaging and fun for attendees.






These four teams won in their respective categories, and trophies were delivers and presented by the Public Relations Division in early May.




