Your comments are important. Comment sheets will be provided at the workshop; they may be given to a WVDOH representative, or mailed to:

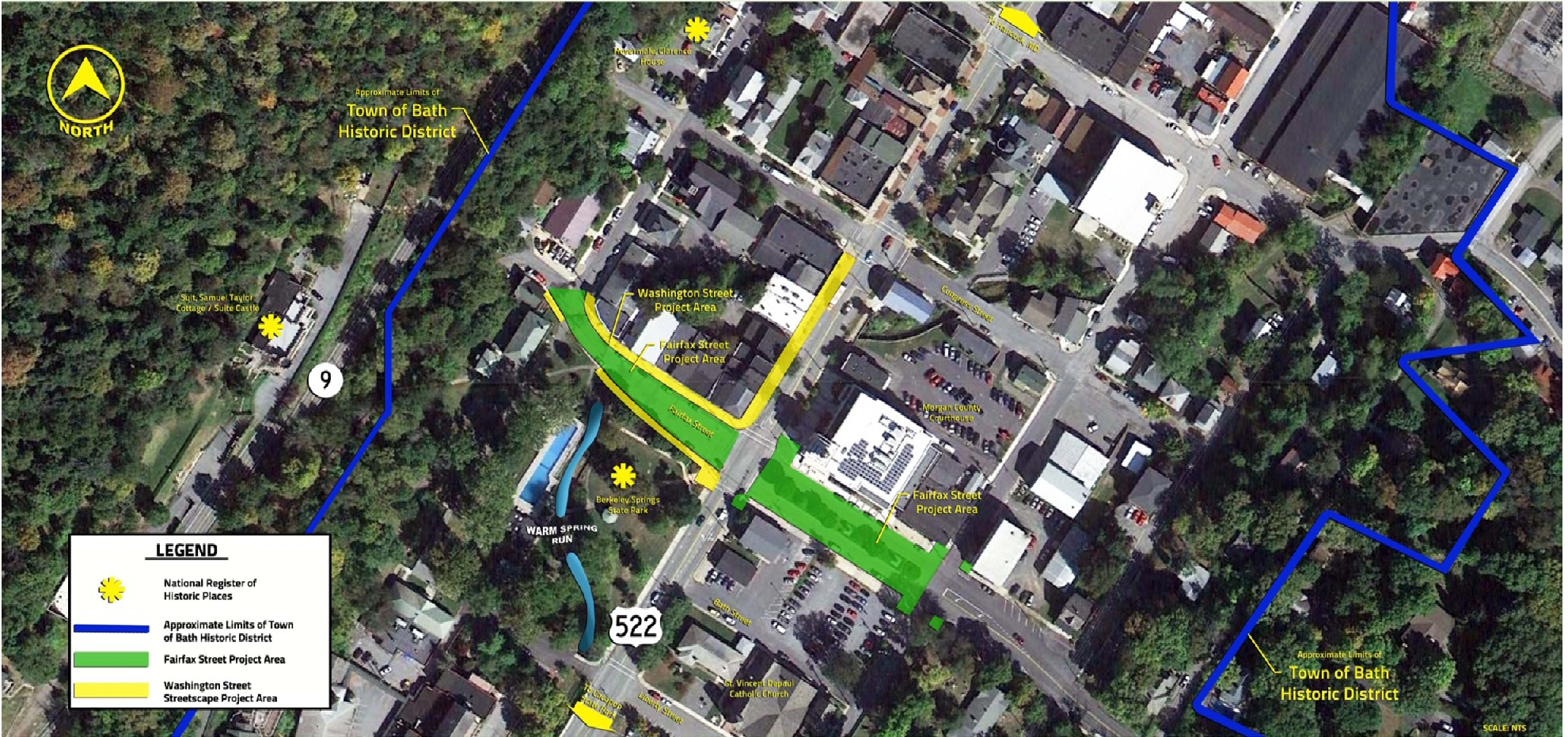

FAIRFAX & WASHINGTON STREETS IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

CONCEPTUAL ALTERNATIVES DESCRIPTIONS

The Fairfax and Washington Streets Improvement Projects consist of streetscape and roadway improvement components. While the roadway alternatives differ in concept, the streetscape component would be included in each, and will be constructed regardless of the current options listed below.

The streetscape component is estimated to cost approximately **\$475,000** (design and construction); this cost is in addition to the roadway cost estimates presented below.

ALTERNATIVE 1, NO-BUILD

This alternative would not involve any construction on the Fairfax Street road surface. There is no cost for this alternative.

ALTERNATIVE 2, NEW PAVERS

This alternative consists of removing all the existing brick pavers on Fairfax Street and replacing them with new brick pavers, with drainage improvements. A preliminary construction cost estimate for this alternative is approximately **\$1,200,000**.

ALTERNATIVE 3, STAMPED CONCRETE

This alternative consists of removing the existing brick pavers on Fairfax Street and constructing a concrete road surface with a stamped brick pattern, with drainage improvements. A preliminary construction cost estimate for this alternative is approximately **\$850,000**.

ALTERNATIVE 4, REUSE OF EXISTING PAVERS & STAMPED CONCRETE

This alternative consists of removing the existing brick pavers on Fairfax Street and constructing a stamped concrete road surface similar to Alternative 3, including drainage improvements. Some of the pavers currently found on Fairfax Street would be incorporated into the new road surface. A preliminary construction cost estimate for this alternative is approximately **\$980,000**.

ALTERNATIVE 5, ASPHALT

This alternative consists of a new asphalt roadway on Fairfax Street. This work would include a new base and drainage improvements. A preliminary cost estimate for this alternative is approximately **\$600,000**.
