US Army Corps of Engineers

- Regulatory authorities include Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act.
- Regulate the placement of fill or dredged material into "waters of the US".
- > Permitting.
- > Mitigation Banking.



US Environmental Protection Agency

- ➤ Has the authority to comment on all environmental issues under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).
- ➤ Review of all of the topics associated with NEPA including upland resources, wetlands, environmental justice, air quality, etc.



US Fish & Wildlife Service

- ➤ Mission is to conserve, protect, and enhance fish, wildlife and plants and their habitats.
- Responsible for threatened or endangered species, migratory birds, significant fisheries and wetlands.
- Comment through the Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act.



WV Department of Environmental Protection

- Division of Water & Waste Management-works to protect, restore and enhance West Virginia's watersheds in part through stream and wetland permitting and compensatory mitigation.
- ➤ Mitigation- Bank, In-lieu fee, Permittee responsible- watershed, on-site in-kind, or off-site and/or out of kind.



WV State Historic Preservation Office

- ➤ Mission is to identify, recognize, preserve and protect West Virginia's prehistoric and historic sites, structures and objects.
- ➤ Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act requires Federal agencies to consider the effects of undertakings on historic resources.



WV Division of Natural Resources


- Legislative authority to conserve and protect wildlife resources.
- ➤ Comment through the Section 401 Water Quality Certification Process to WVDEP.
- ➤ Working on a new inventory of wetlands in WV, as well as a new wetland assessment procedure.




WV Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Air Quality

➤ Transportation Conformity — ensures that projects that receive Federal funding are consistent with air quality goals.




