Formation

- Executive Order 12-12
- August 14, 2012 EO signed
- September 10th Members Announced
- September 14th First BRC Meeting



***WHY**

- System important for mobility
- Enhance safety
- Furthers commercial Interests
- Modernized system needed for modern society
- Jobs for the short-term



WHY

- Improved productivity and competitiveness long-term
- One of four that maintain state and county roads
- WVDOH maintains 92%--36K miles
- ❖ Population 37th but state highway 6th largest
- Highway needs exceeding population growth



WHY

- Average age of bridges 50 years
- 1/3 of bridges structurally deficient or obsolete
- Federal aid declining
- Stakeholders asked for long-term plan
- Commission will facilitate long-term, strategic plan



***COMPOSITION**

- Governor or designee
- Three Senate members (non-voting)
- Three House members (non-voting)
- Secretary of Transportation
- Secretary of Commerce



* COMPOSITION

- Two County Official Members
- Elected City Official-Member of WVML
- Eleven Stakeholder Group Representatives
- Two Representatives of Academic Community
- Three Citizen Members, One from Each Cong. Dist.



* DUTIES

- Analyze overall structure and long-term needs
- Research and analyze funding mechanisms
- Involve public
- Research and define equitable and adequate financing
- Formulate comprehensive action plan
- Propose and recommend legislation

- Infrastructure
 - Goal—Determine long-term needs
 - Approach
 - Analyze Preservation Needs
 - Analyze Expansion Needs
 - Develop recommendation
 - Delivered to Revenue Committee—January 10, 2013



- Preservation Needs
 - Routine Maintenance
 - Preservation
 - Modernization
 - Reconstruction



- Preservation Needs
 - Three funding levels
 - WVDOT Multi-model Transportation Plan 2008-2032
 - Maintain Current Funding Level
 - Continuing System Quality Deterioration
 - \$400 Million per Year Additional
 - System Maintains Current Quality Level
 - \$1 Billion per Year Additional
 - System Quality Greatly Improved
 - Few and Minor Defects



- Revenue Committee Recommendation
 - Current Funding—No Support
 - * \$400 Million—Little to No Support
 - \$1 Billion—Support but not Consensus
 - * \$750 Million—9-3 Vote
 - 1 vote wanted lower amount
 - 2 votes wanted higher



- Expansion Needs
 - Capacity Improvements
 - New Location Capital Improvement Projects
 - 2010 WVDOH long Range Plan
 - Capital Improvement Plan
 - Unfunded needs
 - Cost/Benefit Ratio equal or greater than 1



- Expansion Needs
 - *\$9.4 Billion
 - 25 Year Timeframe
 - \$378 Million/Year Need
 - ♦ \$60 million from current funding
 - *\$318 million unmet need



- Expansion Needs
 - * 25 Years Too Long
 - Unanimous \$380 Million/Year
 - **21.4 Years**



- Highway System Needs Recommendation
 - Preservation--\$750 Million/Year
 - Expansion--\$380 Million/Year
 - Other Considerations
 - Adjust for inflation
 - WVTP transfer—Additional \$59 million/year

- Three Legged Stool
 - Funding the Needs
 - Efficiencies
 - Innovation
 - New revenue



- New Revenue Sources
 - License and Registration Fees
 - Diesel Fuel Taxes
 - Gasoline Taxes
 - Fuel Taxes (General)
 - Vehicle Sales Tax
 - Alternate Fuel Vehicles



- New Revenue Sources
 - Sales Tax on Repairs, Parts & Service
 - Consumer Sales Tax
 - Rainy Day/Surplus Funds
 - Leveraging WV Turnpike
 - Various Tax increases
 - Severance Taxes



- New Revenue Sources
 - Local Funding Options
 - Violation Fines
 - General Revenue Fund Transfers
 - Coal Resources Transportation Fee
 - Mileage Revenue



- Committee Recommended Revenue Sources
 - Increase License and Fees
 - Raise Fuel Excise Tax
 - Alternate Fuel Vehicle Registration Fee
 - Increase Consumer Sales Tax
 - Leverage Tolls on WVTP
 - Raise Cigarette Tax
 - ❖Total=\$446 Million



- Public Relations/Legislative
 - Nine Public Outreach Meetings
 - Real Time and On-Line Survey
 - *1397 Responses
 - Public Comments



Result Summary

- General
 - Roads are important- personally, economically, jobs
 - ❖P3 further development
 - Important to fund safe and efficient roads
 - Roads not in a state of good repair

Most Favored Funding Options

- Sales Tax on Motor Vehicle related Sales/Services
- Continuation of Tolls on WVTP
- Development of State Infrastructure Bank



- Result Summary
 - Least Favored Funding Options
 - Increases in Motor Fuel taxes
 - Increased Consumer Sales Tax
 - Increased Vehicle Sales Tax (Privilege Tax)
 - Local Funding Flexibility
 - Most Favored Cost Efficiency Option
 - Sales Tax on Motor Vehicle related Sales/Services



- Result Summary
 - Most Favored Revenue Generators
 - Continuation of Tolls on WVTP
 - Additional Fees for Alternative Fueled Vehicles
 - Increases in Motor Vehicle Fees and Licenses
 - Most Favored Innovations Option
 - *P3's
 - State Infrastructure Bank



- September 4, 2013 BRC Recommendations (Highlights)
 - Innovative Finance
 - **⇔**P3
 - Continue Use of Tolling
 - Aggressive Use of GARVEEs (\$500M Cap)
 - **SIB**
 - Renewed Emphasis on Local Finance of Highway Projects
 - TIFIA Loans



- September 4, 2013 BRC Recommendations (Highlights)
 - Sustainable Funding
 - Increase DMV Registration and Licensing Fees and Index
 - Alternative Fuel Registration Fee
 - Dedicate Sales and Use Tax on Motor Vehicle Related Items
 - Internet Sales Tax (If passed by Congress)
 - ❖Total=\$103 Million+



- September 4, 2013 BRC Recommendations (Highlights)
 - Future Study
 - Vehicle Miles Traveled
 - Replacement of Fuel Taxes with Consumer Sales
 - Severance Taxes "Future Fund" Partial Dedication
 - ❖Update of the WVDOT 2005 Performance Review
 - WVDOH Efficiencies
 - Current
 - Future Under Development
 - Future Needing Further Study



- September 4, 2013 BRC Recommendations (Highlights)
 - Under Consideration
 - WVPA Recommendation
 - * Raise Bonding Cap to \$1.5 Billion
 - ❖ Issue \$1 Billion In Bonds
 - Provide for Raising Tolls
 - Freeze Rates for Local Users
 - Transfer to WVDOH \$1Billion to Fund Road Projects
 - ❖ 25% of the \$ Projects in Four TP Counties
