Research Program Goals

Improve agency processes and materials through quality research

The goal of a transportation research program is to make a real and positive impact on agency programs and through the agency, the traveling public

Projects should be of good quality and produce useful, implementable or transferable results

Communication

Engage agency staff with communication tools to acquire ideas and distribute results

National Exposure

Through presentations by researchers and by staff at key meetings, communicate research in WV to a national audience such as AASHTO committees, the Transportation Research Board and other national bodies

Certification

Update and maintain a robust Research Manual to meet all requirements and document current processes Assist the agency in documentation and certification for its SPR Part B Program

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SP&R Part B Research Funding

Highway Program Apportionment

 West Virginia receives approximately \$600M of Federal Funding per year in total highway apportionment funds

2% of the total must be dedicated to State Planning and Research – SP&R

- Of that, 2%, 25%, or 0.5% of the total apportionment is dedicated to SP&R Subpart B for research.
- Matching funds of 20% are required, like many highway funding programs
- WVDOT Pooled Fund participation does not require a state match
- SP&R funds currently do not sunset, however, they are subject to annual obligation authority rules and if not expended, could be subject to recission
- States must certify their SP&R Programs Annually

Approximate West Virginia SP&R Subpart B Formula Appropriation by Federal Fiscal Year

These are the funds that can be used for internal and external research projects and research implementation

Project and Program Development

Establish an appropriate budget

• Establish a suitable and sustainable annual budget

Review and update Selection Process

- Select projects that best support the agency and public needs
- Create online tools for idea and proposal collection to document and streamline processes
- Develop a formal process for pooled fund participation

Research Idea and Proposal Solicitation

- Solicit and select ideas internal/external mix –
- Update the Research Problem Statement Solicitation Form and make it an online tool
- · Keep the focus on applied research

Annual Program Development


- Project selection and timelines cyclical and repeatable
- FHWA Approval establish a good rapport and process

Project Management

- Day to day project management works to keep projects on scope and budget
- Focused on deliverables
- Engage steering committees and project sponsors

Pooled Fund Management

Pooled funds are great ways to leverage research dollars

Identifying and selecting funds for participation should be interactive

Must be included in the annual approved work program



Outreach, Documentation and Implementation









Outreach and Training

- National Exposure Identify key conference participation opportunities
- Communication plans for program and projects
- Training for project sponsors (WVDOT) and researchers (Universities and Consultant)
- Coordinate Peer Exchanges

Research Manual

- Research manual should provide clear information on the WVDOT program and its management
- Updates can occur as the program progresses through its first cycle to capture new and best practices

Implementation Support

- Tech Transfer (T²) programs are critical for turning research into productive tools
- These projects do not have to be WVDOT-funded projects. NCHRP or other state research could be turned into tech transfer

Compliance and Reporting

- Meet federal reporting requirements
- Establish and monitor performance metrics that matter
