

DOT/FMCSA Post Accident Drug Test Protocol, Informational Video

1. Would a drug test be ordered if a single-vehicle accident was due to loss of traction, with no one injured and no citation issued from law enforcement?
2. The instructor recommends drug and alcohol testing be completed as soon as possible after an accident. Does he tell the viewer to try to complete an alcohol within 1.5 hours, 2 hours, or 2.5 hours?
3. When an employee with a Commercial Drivers License completes a post accident drug test, his/her sample would be tested using a 5-panel test. PCP, Opioids, Cocaine, and Amphetamines (including methamphetamines) are 4 of them. What is the fifth prohibited drug in the testing panel?

4. True or False

The instructor recommends that a driver should inform his/her physician of all prescribed and authorized medications currently being taken, and ask them if taking such medications are consistent with the safe performance of their duties.

5. True or False

A post-accident drug test should be conducted as soon as possible after the incident, but if delayed, must be completed within 32 hours.

6. True or False

A drug test will always be completed when a fatality results from a TW's vehicle accident.
