     Program
    - 6 Year Federal Highways Administration Document
      - First 4 Years Required and Next 2 Years for Information
    - All Federal Aid Projects must be Approved and on the Federal STIP
      - Amendment and Adjustments Done Regularly



- Execution of the Highway Program
  - Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement
     Program
    - Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs)
      - Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP)
      - Projects First Approved in TIP then in STIP



- Execution of the Highway Program
  - State Statewide Transportation Improvement Program
    - Same Time Frame as Federal STIP


