## **DOT/FMCSA Post Accident Drug Test Protocol, Informational Video**

- 1. Would a drug test be ordered If a single-vehicle accident was due to loss of traction, with no one injured and no citation issued from law enforcement?
- 2. The instructor recommends drug and alcohol testing be completed as soon as possible after an accident. Does he tell the viewer to try to complete an alcohol within 1.5 hours, 2 hours, or 2.5 hours?
- 3. When an employee with a Commercial Drivers License completes a post accident drug test, his/her sample would be tested using a 5-panel test. PCP, Opioids, Cocaine, and Amphetamines (including methamphetamines) are 4 of them. What is the fifth prohibited drug in the testing panel?

## 4. True or False

The instructor recommends that a driver should inform his/her physician of all prescribed and authorized medications currently being taken, and ask them if taking such medications are consistent with the safe performance of their duties.

## 5. True or False

A post-accident drug test should be conducted as soon as possible after the incident, but if delayed, must be completed within 32 hours.

A drug test will always be completed when a fatality results from a TW's vehicle accident.
